Dave has sat on numerous local and national boards including the National Marrow Donor Program, Washington State University's Foundation, and was an executive board member for the Penn-Jersey Red Cross and executive board member for the Philadelphia Gift of Life Organization.

Dave joined the National Bone Marrow Registry and donated bone marrow to a 17- year-old with leukemia. Dave is the son of Dave Huddleston, Sr. and Mary Carolene (Keys) Huddleston.
